Course Offerings: Honors Algebra I (eighth grade only), Honors Algebra II, Honors Geometry, Pre-Calculus, AP Calculus AB; Honors Physics; Honors Biology; Honors Anatomy, Honors Introduction to Engineering; AP English Language and Composition, AP English Literature and Composition, Honors Spanish III. Additionally, AP exams are available for the students in May of each year. Dual Credit Courses may be taken upon completion of a student's 10th grade year.

GPA Computation:

1. The GPA and numeric averages are calculated on all academic subjects, grades 9-12.
2. AP denotes Advanced Placement Course; H denotes Honors course. Semester grades in all AP classes and honors courses are weighted due to the difficulty of these courses.

Class Rank:

Class ranking is determined by the Numeric Average and is taken from grades earned in academic classes in grades 9-12. AP and Honors courses are weighted. Class ranks are reported to colleges on the students' transcript after they complete the first semester of their senior year, however, class ranking is not final until the end of the school year.

Extra Curricular:

Extra Curricular Activities are available beginning in 5th grade.
