Teacher Inservice

In addition to annual compliance training, we completed training on Biblical Worldview Immersion, Eight Great Smarts (8 kinds of intelligences and how to nurture them in our kids as they learn to master their unique skills and God given callings) and attended a training with Central Texas Christian taught by Dr. Jon Eckert, co-director of the Baylor School of Leadership.

Insurance

Summer Camps

There were also weeklong Athletic Camps in Football, Basketball and Volleyball. While a 6-week strength, conditioning and weightlifting camp was offered.

Early Childhood

Pre-Kindergarten is off to a great start. RRCA has two classes with 31 students and two classroom aides. The Pre-K goals this year are the following: 1) Improve the end of year Bible Assessment to be more child friendly and age appropriate; 2) Update Math, Reading and Bible subjects in Curriculum Trak, so every subject is complete and accurately reflects the instruction of classroom units; and 3) The team is committed this year to help children understand that they are each wonderfully created in the image of God, and their identity is in that fact. Teachers are committed to changing the language in their classrooms, so children recognize that their feelings are not their identity. This is a culture shift that can begin with our youngest students.

Elementary

Elementary is off to a wonderful start. We are working through emotions of being away from home. Each day was easier than the day before at drop off. We stayed steady at three classes each grade level except 5th. We have four 5th grade classes. All classes start off with review material while students learn procedures in their new grade. Teachers will be working on being biblically immersed, showing kindness and gentleness while growing students to be the best versions God created them to be.

We had our first chapel today and it was a huge blessing. The 5th grade students in the Shepherd Cru welcomed the pledge class and introduced the speaker. Rock the Flock led worship while students and parents praised. It is truly an amazing time. We gave out the first, "Crusader is Crushing It" award to three teachers. This award will be given out to students and teachers throughout the year.

College and Career

- An interest survey was sent to the high school students for our first partnership with Chik-Fil-A (Leader Academy). Twenty-six students completed the survey. During the first project, the students are led through the project. by the last project, the students are running the entire project from logistics to communication and everything in between.

Spiritual:

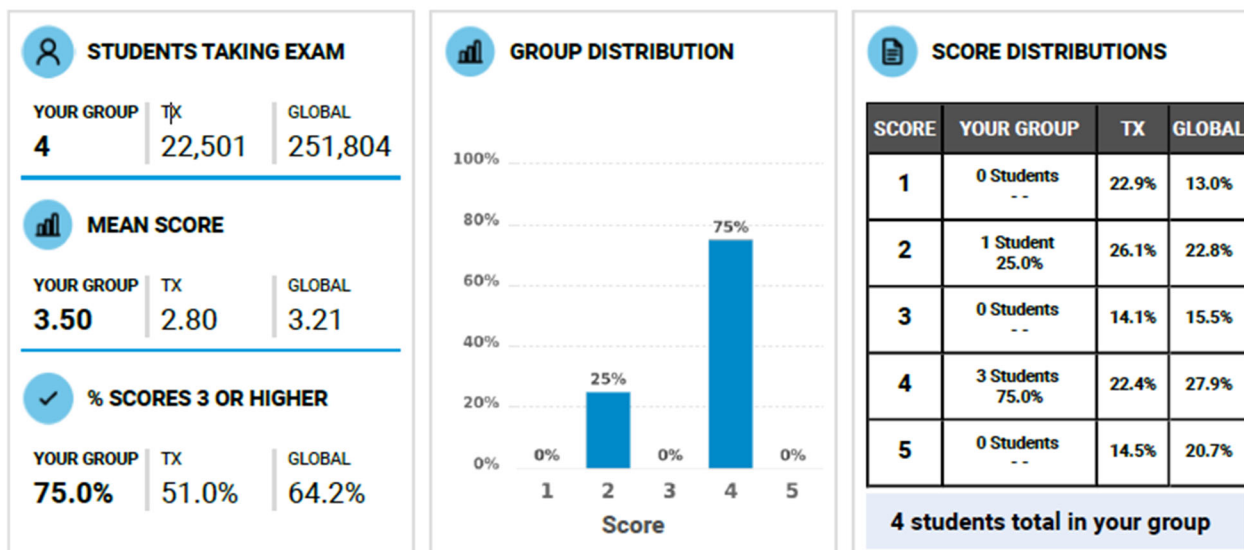

Each month has a focus, and we will be able to provide chapel speakers with an outline of the monthly focus so that Chapel and Discipleship group connect.

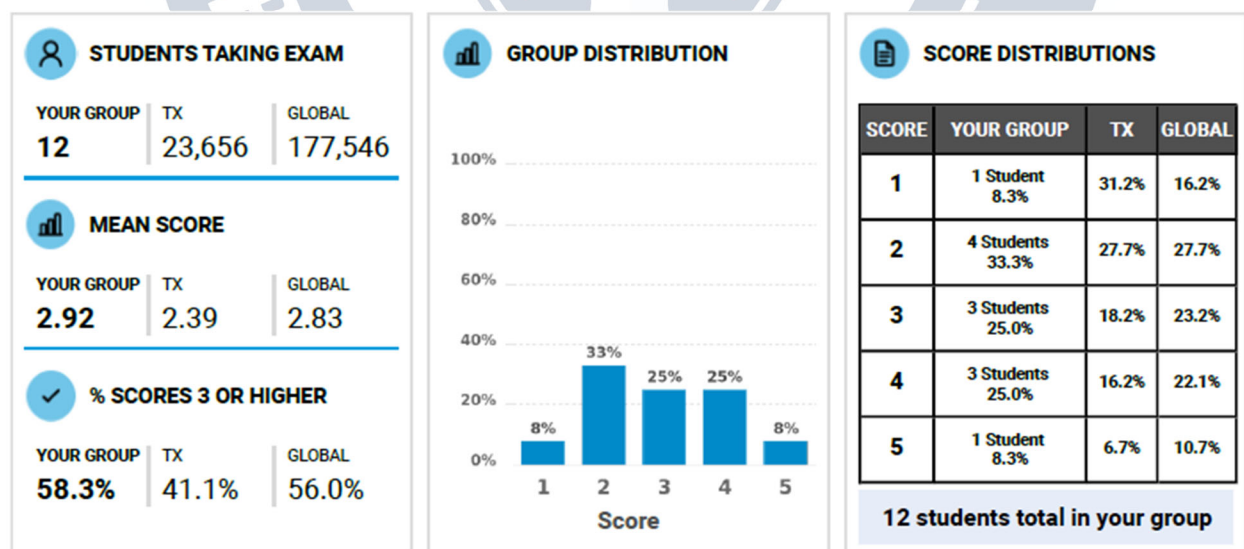
May 2024 AP Score Results

Students scoring a “3” or above receive college credit in Texas public universities

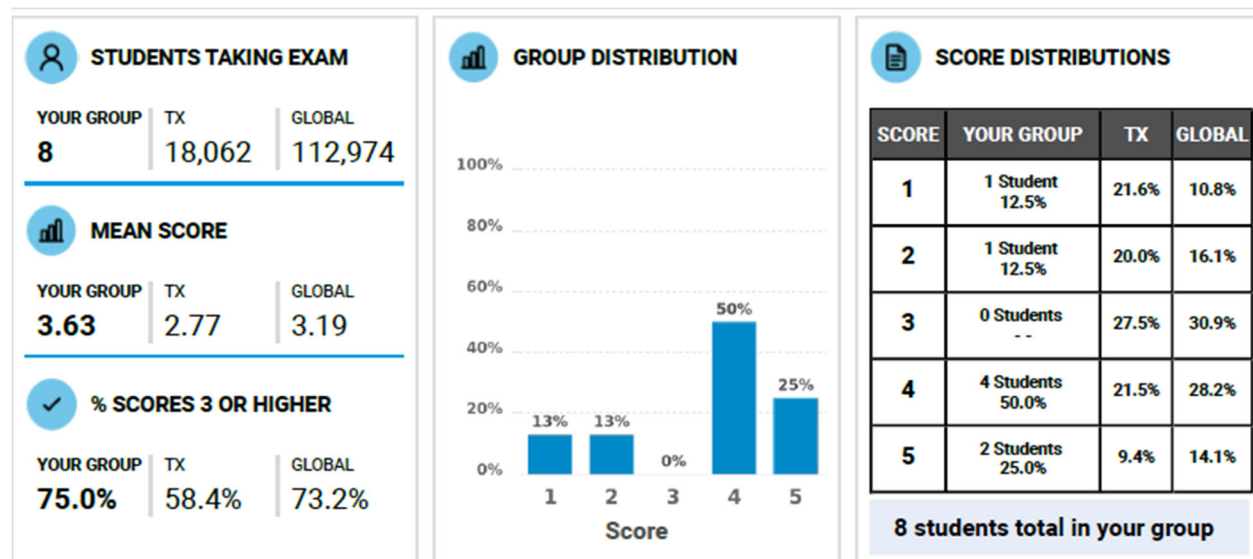
Calculus AB



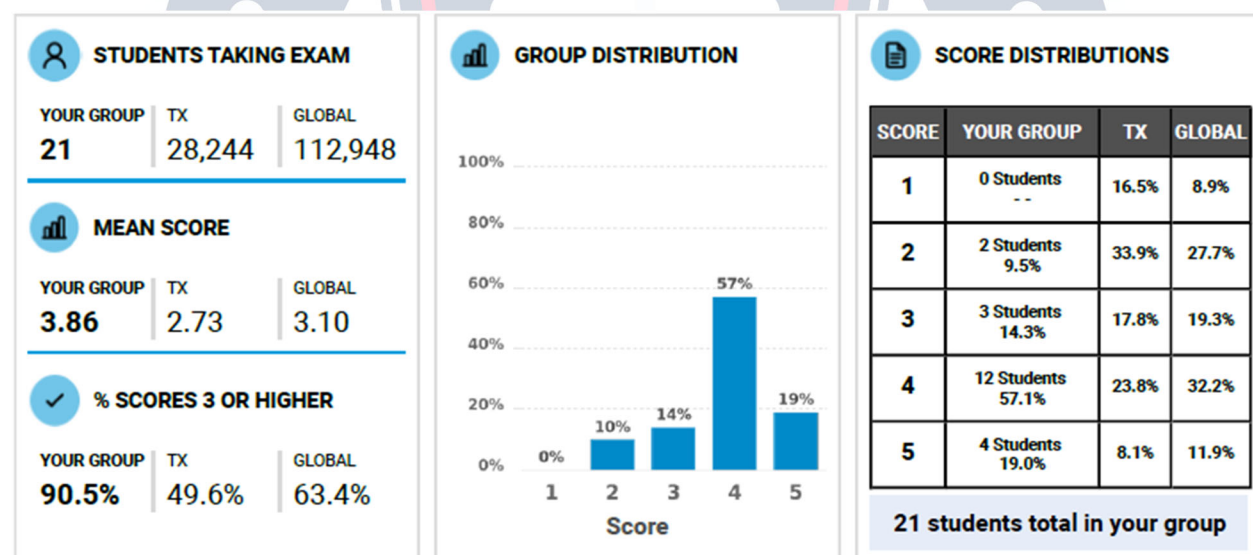
