TREKAI

TrekAI is an AI platform that uses the Socratic Method to assist the students, by teaching them how to use AI technology ethically and to reteach concepts for understanding. It can be adapted to an individual student's unique educational environment. Teachers can easily upload their own content, creating a personalized AI tutor that meets their students' needs:

- Seamlessly create and share activities for your students
- Upload school-specific content
- Custom features for faith-based schools

Trek AI is designed to be a supportive learning companion, not a shortcut. Instead of providing direct answers, it guides students through the problem-solving process, encouraging critical thinking and deeper understanding. This approach ensures that students truly learn and grow, rather than simply copying answers.

The school has created an AI policy and Rubric to help students know when it is appropriate and when it is not appropriate to use AI on assignments.
