Early Childhood

Reading: Teachers are introducing parts of a book and reading left to right. This week's theme was about authors and illustrations, and students enjoyed reading several classics. The children made their own books by providing teachers with verbal narrations that they recorded. Students will create illustrations for their first books and "read" these aloud during class.

Math: Children are counting 1-10 and utilizing 1:1 correspondence with objects.

Pre-K Bible lessons this week were about Noah's ark and his obedience to God, and how God kept Noah and his family safe. Classes discussed how God keeps us safe and provides for our needs.

Scripture Memory: Be strong and brave. Do not be afraid. Do not lose hope. I am the Lord your God. I will be with you everywhere you go. Joshua 1:9

Elementary

Chapel has continued with Relying on God. We are focusing on what it looks like to rely on God. We learned we should move with God and seek his will in all we do. We are having lots of parents stay for chapel. It is a warm, supportive feeling to have them join each week. We have begun the Bible challenge. All students will learn a verse for each quarter and the Lord's Prayer, Old and New books of the bible. It has been fun to see students in the word and encouraging each other.

All grades and subjects are in full swing. Kinder to 2nd grade is focusing on systems while they review and introduce new topics. 3rd grade is in the big shift from teacher leading all instruction and work to learning how to be independent in completing work after a lesson. It is a huge shift for the students. They are all doing so well. We are so proud of them. 4th and 5th grade are doing amazing. They are learning and full of joy.

Secondary

Spiritual: This month's chapel theme is the "Comparison Game." Speakers will be presenting messages that help students see the dangers of comparison and learn to look to Jesus as the one true standard. For the first high school chapel, Collin Russell, senior and member of the praise band, performed a song that he composed with the guidance of Mrs. Fair during worship.

Academics:

History Department Spotlight: The History Department led age-appropriate activities across all grade levels to honor and remember the events of September 11, 2001. Sixth grade students learned the foundational who, what, where, when, why, and how of the day through a PowerPoint presentation and discussion of its causes and impact. Seventh grade reflected on Christ-like character and the fruits of the Spirit through a "Daily Bellringer" video timeline and

stories of people helping one another. Eighth grade engaged with excerpts from the 9/11 Memorial and Museum's 2025 digital learning experience, considering how the attacks changed the world and why remembrance matters. In high school, ninth through twelfth grade students studied the historical context through a presentation of images, a remembrance discussion, and a look at the Changing of the Guard at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier. Sophomores and juniors also reflected on the significance of 9/11 within their parents' lifetime and its impact on their own generation.

In the Class of 2025, four students have received the School Recognition Award presented by the College Board National Recognition Program. One senior qualifies for National Merit Scholarship recognition.

College and Career

- We have already hosted 2 Universities for our Juniors and Seniors. Three more are scheduled for September.
- Academic Advisor has attended the Texas Together workshop- A&M and UT Austin highlighted fall 2025 numbers and then presented changes for fall 2026 enrollment- UT will be moving to top 5%, and A&M will continue with top 10% automatic admission. They also outlined "non-traditional" pathways to admission to both Universities.
- AP numbers are up- we have 71 students enrolled in AP courses
- ACC numbers are also up- we have 52 students enrolled in ACC Fall courses. We also had the largest number of students take summer advanced courses, some through ACC and some on our campus.
- Currently preparing for PSAT8/9, PSAT/NMSQT, and SAT School Day for over 200 students

Athletics

The fall season is off to a strong start with high levels of participation across all sports. Volleyball fields nine teams, with JV undefeated and varsity off to a solid district start. Football has strong numbers at the junior high level, supporting both 7th and 8th grade teams, while the varsity squad continues to compete despite early injuries. Cross country has experienced significant growth, with both high school and junior high teams competing successfully. In addition, RRCA is preparing for its inaugural high school softball season this spring, expanding athletic opportunities for our students.

Weight Room Upgrade

We are pleased to announce a partnership with Powerlift for major upgrades to our weight room. The installation was completed on Thursday, September 4th. This enhanced facility will have a significant impact on the athletics program by improving training opportunities, supporting athletic performance, and contributing to the overall development of our student-athletes.

Volleyball

- Program fields nine teams this season (Varsity, JV, JH-2, 6th-3, 5th-2).
- Varsity record: 16-9 overall, 2-0 in district play.
- JV record: 14-0 (undefeated).
- Middle school participation: 76 athletes. Competition began after Labor Day, with teams showing early success.

Football

- Varsity: Team has faced early-season injuries but continues to compete well in initial games.
- Junior High: 31 athletes, allowing both 7th grade and 8th grade teams to be fielded, and the scheduling of four additional games. First game resulted in a 45-0 win with full team participation.
- Flag Football: Program includes two 6th grade teams and one 5th grade team, now underway.

Cross Country

- High School: 11 athletes (9 boys, 2 girls). Boys' team has qualified to score at meets and has already earned individual medals and team points in the JV division.
- Junior High: 11 athletes (7 boys, 4 girls). Teams are consistently logging mileage and competing effectively.

Softball

- RRCA will begin its inaugural high school softball season this spring.
- Facilities: Work is in progress to secure practice and game fields.
- Competition: Schedule development is underway, with the opportunity to participate in district play despite being in the middle of the TAPPS two-year district cycle.
- Staffing: Efforts are being made to secure a coaching staff.
