Professional Development

50th Year Celebration

The 50th Year Celebration was a great event, and we are so thankful for all who attended. We received positive feedback on the evening. It was nice to see former teachers, alumni and former families.

Veterans Day Celebration

On Monday November 10th we held an all-school Veterans Day Celebration. We had over 200 parents who joined us. Jason Colborn was our guest speaker and different student groups performed to coincide with our patriotic theme. We are hopeful that our veterans and families were honored, and that we adequately displayed our heartfelt gratitude for their service and sacrifice.

Flourishing Schools Survey

We received the results of the flourishing school survey. Responses were received from 361 Students (6th – 12th); 62 Faculty and Staff; 163 Parents; 31 Alumni and 8 Board members. In addition to the initial portion of the survey, students 8th grade and up completed the Faith Index. Some initial results:

Strengths

The school has financial resources to operate efficiently.

A strategic financial plan and master facilities plan is in place and financial planning is a strength of the board.

When planning for change, the potential impact on the school, the classroom, students and the overall system are considered.

Data is used to gauge school results and effectiveness, determine goal attainment and address problems the school faces.

Teachers are credentialed and have classroom experience.

Growth Opportunities

Students would benefit from staff efforts to point out their individual talents and show how they fit into God's bigger plan, as well as greater staff awareness of students' struggles at school and at home.

Leaders (including the board) can become interdependent through transparency about weakness and relying on others to offset those weaknesses.

Caring for and including students in class, as well as addressing bullying, can help improve the students perception of the school environment.

Alumni are less likely to view reliance on God as key to personal growth and may not readily view the school as having strengthened their faith.

Many students view Christians negatively and are more likely to be facing a time of spiritual disengagement or doubt.

Early Childhood

Academic: Math -students are learning how to use a ten-frame as a tool for problem solving addition equations up to 20. Reading – students are blending sounds phonetically to read real and nonsensical words.

Spiritual: Students read the *Pumpkin Parable* as they carved pumpkins and celebrated the light that God's gives to shine for the world to see. They are also reading the story of Joshua, and students reenacted the Battle of Jericho in class.

Social Studies: Students are learning about the democratic voting process by choosing their next celebration- a balloon party was the winner by the majority.

Fun: Students had learned about nocturnal animals and had class with flashlights and glow sticks on 10/31 for "nocturnal day."

Elementary

Spiritual: We have spent a month in chapel remembering Bible Stories. We had high school students share Jonah and the Whale. They did an amazing job sharing and pointing the elementary students back to a God that seeks us and provides opportunities to be used by him. Mr. D'Amico told the story of David and Goliath. He used a dad from the audience and made the story come to life. EPIC came and brought lots of excitement. They reminded us that God wants to be in relationship with us and we need Jesus.

Academics: We had the in-class spelling bees this month. It is impressive how many of them are talented at spelling. Round Rock Fire Fighters came to present fire safety. They do an amazing job of keeping the student's attention while also teaching them fire safety. We are looking forward to International Math Competition and PSIA coming up. We are working hard as the semester continues.

Secondary

Spiritual: On October 20, our high school students participated in HS Recharge Day — a special event designed to encourage spiritual renewal, strengthen community, and build meaningful connections through engaging activities and interactive games. Guest speaker Nolan O'Connor shared a powerful message centered on the theme *"Make Him Known,"* challenging students to live so that Christ is evident through their words, actions, and attitudes. The day provided students with a purposeful opportunity to step away from their daily routines, reflect on their personal walk with God, and be inspired to live out their faith in every area of life.

College and Career

- Academic Advisor attended the ACC Partnership Summit.
- Academic Advisor attended the Texas Tech/Oklahoma University update.
- SAT/PSAT Proctors were trained through College Board to administer the PSAT/NMSQT and the PSAT8/9.
- 8th-11th grade students took the PSAT on October 15th.
- College visits to RRCA- UNT, Texas State, Texas State Technical College, ETBU, Texas Tech, A&M, Texas State Technical College, and Tarleton University
- Several students attended Texas State Technical College's Discovery Day on November 6th and learned more about careers in the trade and technical fields.
- At Q1 Progress Report, 71 students were failing at least 1 class, with student, parent, teacher, and advisor intervention; the number dropped to 29 at Q1 Report Card.
- Career chapel/assembly for Elementary and Middle school are in the works. The third annual High School Career Day is also in the planning stages.

Athletics

The fall athletic season has wrapped up, and it was filled with outstanding performances, growth, and Crusader pride across all levels!

Volleyball

Our volleyball teams had tremendous success this season!

- JV Volleyball finished *undefeated in district play* (10–0) and posted an impressive overall record of 24–1.
- Varsity Volleyball placed *2nd in district* (10–2) and ended the year with a 34–15 record, advancing to the TAPPS 4A Area Finals before falling to John Paul II.

At the elementary and junior high levels, our teams competed hard throughout CAPPS league play and tournaments:

- 6th Grade Navy team went *undefeated* during the regular season (without dropping a set) and captured the CAPPS 5/6 6A Volleyball Championship.
- 5th Grade Red team finished strong, *winning their last four games* and claiming the CAPPS 5/6 2A Volleyball Tournament Championship, defeating a team they had lost to earlier in the season.
- 6th Grade Red team earned Runner-Up honors in the CAPPS 5/6 4A Volleyball Tournament.

Football

Our Varsity Football team battled through injuries, finishing *3rd in district* and earning a spot in the TAPPS 6-Man Division I Playoffs, traveling to North Dallas to take on Coram Deo Academy–Plano on November 14th.

The JH Football team enjoyed an *undefeated season* and claimed the STFC Football Championship on October 25th.

The 6th Grade Navy Flag Football team also had a stellar season, finishing *2nd in the regular season* and reaching the CAPPS 5/6 6A Championship Game, where they narrowly fell 21–19.

Cross Country

Our Varsity Cross Country program made school history this fall as the first boys' team to qualify and compete at the TAPPS 4A State Championships in Waco on October 27th, finishing *16th out of 30 teams*. Two RRCA girls also represented the Crusaders at state and ran exceptionally well.

At the Junior High CAPPS Cross Country Championships on October 18th, the boys' team

finished *5th overall*, highlighted by 8th grader Mason Tate, who placed *8th individually* to earn a medal.

Basketball

The winter season is already in full swing! Games began the week of November 10th, with tournaments scheduled over Thanksgiving Break and our Crusader Tournament coming up the *first weekend of December*.

High school district play tips off on *December 9th*, and we're excited to field 13 basketball teams from 5th–8th grade this year — totaling 104 games, including 66 home games (5th-HS) in the RRCA gym.
