I pray this letter finds you all well, and celebrating the New Year. In my personal life, I pray 2026 is a true Reset. I am writing with humility and sincerity regarding our daughters' outstanding tuition balance. This is not an easy letter to write, but I feel it is important to be completely open, honest, and transparent as I ask for your consideration.

Last year was definitely a hard year for myself and our family. I experienced an unexpected job loss that placed my family in a very difficult financial position. In my years of life, I have been fortunate to never have been in this position. I tried to maneuver the situation as best as possible but I was not prepared for the snowfall effect that took place. My husband and I got behind on everything, and when less money is coming in or no money (even for a few months) it's very hard to catch up and simply overcome.

Despite my best efforts to recover and remain current, I have struggled to fully catch up. I have made small extra payments whenever I am able, trying to withhold commitment and responsibility, but I still have an outstanding balance of \$2791.51. Our daughters' educations at RRCA has meant more to our family than I can adequately express. The Christian values, academic excellence and spiritual foundation the girls receive at RRCA have always

been a blessing, but especially during this season of great challenge for us. This community at RRCA has played an important role in their growth and stability which was beyond needed during a very difficult year.

With great humility and a level of humbleness that cannot be explained, I am asking if the board would consider extending grace by Forgiving the remaining balance. I understand the responsibilities the school carries and do not make this request lightly. I simply ask for prayerful consideration, trusting in compassion and understanding during a time of upheaval, chaos, and limited means. My (and our) hearts and goal are to have the girls remain at RRCA until they graduate as Seniors and carry the love, compassion and knowledge obtained throughout their lives.

Thank you for taking the time to read this letter and for your continued service to the school, its families, and ultimately to our Heavenly Father. Regardless of the outcome, I am deeply grateful for the support and care that RRCA has shown myself, my husband and our children. I once again appreciate your time, consideration, support and prayers.
