The Board of Directors meeting was called to order at 5:03 pm. Allan Keith prayed over the meeting. Todd Whitley motioned for an approval of the agenda, Kristi Roark seconded, all were in favor, and the motion passed. Gregg Johnson motioned that the Board minutes from January be approved, Kristi Roark seconded, all were in favor and the motion passed.

Board training articles were provided on two different subjects: the new wave of student activism, and the new tax credits that are available that can result in scholarships for students. ACSI will be an SGO (scholarship granting organization) and students can apply for a scholarship. Parents can donate to receive a tax credit (to reduce their taxes).

Financials

David Fenwick presented the financials. The Balance Sheet is in great shape. Craig Debevoise had not been updating the interest in the CDs, but he is now working on that. On the Profit and Loss Statement, the Academic competitions line is higher than normal for the month, but overall YTD we will be fine. Buildings and Grounds expenses include the perimeter fencing that we had installed earlier in the year. Athletics is checking with Athletic Boosters to see what amount they will be covering of this year's expenses.

We currently use Principal for our 401K. We also have our short-term and long-term disability insurance through them as well. Clint Potts suggested it may be better to move from Principal to T-Rowe Iron because it will cost us less in terms of fees. The Board determined it wasn't enough of a cost savings to move everything.

We had a family that left the school with a bill of \$14,000 last year, and the family is now down to \$12,000 that they still owe. They called to ask for a substantial discount. We do not plan to offer them a substantial discount but may offer them a lump sum of no less than 60-70% of the total amount due.

Head Of School Report

We currently have 744 enrolled students. We were supposed to know about the TEFA accounts in early April, but TEFA had to extend the deadline for two weeks, because Islamic schools sued the Comptroller regarding TEFA funds.

We had our accreditation visit in February, and the summary of the report is provided in the Board packet. They gave us 5 recommendations and many commendations to our school.

Administration went to Washington, D.C. with the 8th grade students and many parent chaperones. Arlington National Cemetery was very impactful and meaningful as one student put a wreath on his grandparents' grave.

The Class of 2026 Commencement ceremony is May 16 at 2 p.m. The June Board meeting will be at Allen Keith's on June 11 at 5 p.m. Cathleen Feroese asked if the Fine Arts banner could be put up in the gym, but Becky Blauser said these were going to be put up in the gym hallway. Cathleen also wrote an email to the Board, thankful that RRCA supports and provides adult chaperones at events for bus driving, chaperoning, and judging.

Todd Whitley motioned that the meeting be adjourned, Kristi Roark seconded, all were in favor and the meeting was adjourned at 6 pm.
